NJ Jazz Education Achievement Award Winner 2011

Denis DiBlasio



Baritone saxophone and flute Artist Denis DiBlasio directs the jazz program at Rowan University in New Jersey. He is also the Executive Director of The Maynard Ferguson Institute of Jazz at Rowan. With nine recordings of his own along with published texts, arrangements, and compositions, DiBlasio is known through out the world. After five years as Music Director with Maynard Ferguson along with touring on his own, DiBlasio continues to travel around the world performing and teaching. His approach of keeping things simple, informative and positive keeps his schedule extremely busy, booking dates sometimes three years in advance. His inspirational connection with young musicians is what makes a DiBlasio clinic so special. Keeping things attainable and fun make up the foundation of his friendly approach. It's what some people have termed 'Edutainment'. Why not?

Jazz Choir News

The NJ Honors Jazz Choir begins its 14th season with rehearsals in September, culminating in November with performances at the NJEA Convention and NJPAC. This year we have 16 vocalists and 4 instrumentalists, representing 13 schools throughout the state. Justin Binek, head of Vocal Jazz Studies at the University of the Arts, will again be directing the ensemble.

Last season we initiated Region Jazz Choirs in all three regions. Over 80 vocalists participated. The ensembles performed with the Region Jazz Bands in April. Many thanks to Charles Postas for organizing and directing the Region I Jazz Choir, and to Cindy Hardyal for organizing and directing the Region II Jazz Choir. Application forms and audition materials will be available on the website in December. Audition requirements are posted in Tempo Magazine.


